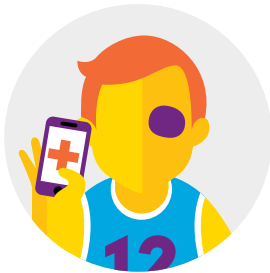


Eye injuries aren't a disease we don't have a cure for. We know exactly how to keep them from happening—and how to prevent the blindness and other eye damage that results.

What should you do if someone gets injured?



Apply a small cold compress to reduce pain and swelling. Be careful not to apply any pressure.



If a black eye, pain, or visual disturbance occurs (even if the eye wasn't hit that hard) contact your doctor or go to the Emergency Room immediately.

What NOT to do:



DO NOT touch, rub, or apply pressure to the eye



DO NOT try to remove an object that is stuck in the eye



DO NOT apply ointment or medication to the eye

 If you stay calm, and act fast, you can help prevent lasting eye damage.
